FEBRUARY FIELD TRIP

St George area dinosaur track sites

The GSN SNC meeting for February will be a field trip to tour the remarkable dinosaur track sites of the Warner Valley and Johnson Farm sites in St. George, Utah. This field trip is scheduled for Saturday, February 24. Any member planning to attend the field trip should notify Bruce Hurley via e-mail at rocks2bwh@aol.com by noon on February 20. Those individuals with larger vehicles, especially higher clearance vehicles, who are willing to drive for the trip, should express this in the e-mail and describe the type of vehicle they will be bringing. Those riding in the vehicles are expected to contribute to the reimbursement of fuel costs for that vehicle.

The trip will begin at 8:00 am in the parking lot of the Speedway Casino/Ramada Inn, just off the I-15 North exit at Cheyenne. To access the Speedway/Ramada, exit east from I-15 and turn left at the first stop light, which is Civic Center, and then left again, into the southwest corner of parking lot.

The Johnson Farm Site is considered by some to be among the most significant dinosaur track sites in North America. It contains a unique collection of reptile, fish, plant and trace fossils.

As an added treat, at 1:00 pm there will be a lecture by Utah State Paleontologist, Dr. Jim Kirkland. Unfortunately, **collecting of fossils is prohibited at both sites.** These sites are, however, excellent sites for photographing fossils. It has been suggested that members bring along a small broom or brush, as the tracks at Warner Valley tend to get covered by blowing sand.

UNLV GeoSymposium



The 2nd Annual Las Vegas GeoSymposium is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, April 20 & 21, 2007 at the Marjorie Barrick Museum on the UNLV campus.

The GeoSymposium is a student-run geology research colloquium designed to provide graduates and undergraduates with an opportunity to present posters, or talks on their original research and receive feedback from industry, civic, and government professionals as well as academics. Local and national scientific and professional companies are invited to attend.

The first day of this mini-conference will include poster presentations, talks and plenty of time for students and professionals to interact. The second day, there will be a field trip exploring local geologic formations of the Lake Mead area.

The research presented at the 2007 Las Vegas GeoSymposium represents some of the most recent science advanced in the Geoscience Department over the last academic year. At the 2006 symposium more than 30 students presented.

Some of the topics from last year's talks and posters included the latest information on Great Basin soils, Costa Rican speleothems, high-resolution seismic reflection, shear zone constraint mechanisms, and Nevada groundwater systems.


