Learning Outcomes: After successfully completing this course, students will be able to: 1) identify the attributes that define a high-quality scientific poster; 2) design a poster presentation on a topic related to their own research; 3) produce a poster using Adobe Illustrator and other graphics tools; and 4) present their poster to a critical audience at the UNLV Spring 2018 Geosymposium.
